

BIBLIOGRAPHY ON YELLOW LEAF DISEASE OF ARECANUT (*Areca Catechu* Linn.)

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Arecanut (*Areca Catechu* L) is one of the important commercial crops of India. It is estimated that nearly four million people in the country are engaged in the production, processing and trade of arecanut.

Among the diseases of the crop the "yellow leaf disease" is the most severe one. The causal factors leading to yellowing of leaves, weakening of the palms and its ultimate death are under investigation and therefore specific control measures are lacking.

Against this background it is hoped that the present compilation of available information on this malady will be useful not only to the students but also to other interested groups.
